Introduction

When you learn that your sight or hearing are failing, you may react with disbelief, anger, shock, and fear about the future.

The thought of life with a dual sensory loss is a difficult one that can cause communication problems, isolation, and frustration for both you and your family. A hearing and sight loss will bring changes more easily if you know where to get help and support from people who understand what you are going through.

This booklet will point you in the right direction to get that help and support.

Health

■ **Sight** – if you are experiencing problems with your eye sight then you can ask your doctor to refer you to a Consultant Ophthalmologist at your local Eye unit. Early treatment may help to avoid permanent sight damage.

Following your appointment with the Ophthalmologist you may be referred to a Low Vision Clinic for an assessment to see if low vision aids, such as magnifiers and special glasses, can help you. Some of this equipment can be issued free of charge.

Your local eye unit may have a Sight Loss Advisor attached to the clinic who can offer emotional support and advice on the services that are available.

If you have a hearing loss remember to advise the clinic staff as some tests may effect your vision and you will not be able to lip-read.

Hearing – if you are experiencing problems with your hearing which cannot be treated by your doctor then you can be referred to a ENT (Ear, Nose and Throat) Consultant or an Audiologist for diagnosis of your hearing loss.

As a result of this diagnosis you may be issued with a hearing aid.

Your local Audiology Department may have a Hearing Therapist or a Communication Rehabilitation Officer available who can offer emotional support and information on the services available.

Hampshire County Council (HCC) Sensory Services

HCC Sensory teams have specially trained staff in dual loss who can give you information and advice. These staff can arrange a meeting where you can talk about the effect of your sight and hearing loss on you, your family and your friends.

You will be able to find out if there is any help available with communication, access to information or specialist equipment to help you manage the tasks of day-to-day life.

The dual loss worker aims to provide a service which addresses the very specific needs and possible isolation that people who have a dual loss may experience.

Registration

If your sight and hearing loss is likely to be permanent, it may be easier to get help, advice and some concessions if you are registered with Hampshire County Council Adult Services Department.

You do not have to be registered as disabled to be eligible for services from Adult Services.

Registration does not automatically mean that you will qualify for services from Adult Services.

To be registered as having a dual loss you will need to have;

- **A Certificate of Vision Impairment (CVI) from your Ophthalmologist as being Severely sight impaired (Blind) or Sight impaired (Partially Sighted)**

PLUS

- **A hearing loss**

There are three categories for hearing loss registration –

- **Hard of Hearing (e.g. prescribed hearing aid)**
- **Deaf (signing/writing)**
- **Deaf (speaking/lipreading)**

You will then be issued with one registration card.

Registration is voluntary and once registered you can ask to be removed from the register at any time.

Your local Sensory Services Team can help with any questions you may have about registration and the registration process.

The benefits of registration are;

- **A Disabled Person's railcard which gives discount on rail fares for you and a carer – contact your local train station for details**
- **Some reduced travel costs – your local Council can give you information about concessionary schemes operating in your area.**
- **Free NHS eye tests**
- **Free use of Directory Enquiries – phone 0800 587 0195 for an application form and more information**
- **Equipment to help you at work through the Access to Work scheme – contact your local Job Centre Plus for more information**
- **Some specialist equipment for people with sight and/or hearing loss is VAT exempt – contact your local tax office for more details or visit their website www.HMRC.gov.uk.**
- **Their leaflet VAT 701-7-02 explains about tax exemption for people with disabilities.**

If your CVI registration is Severely sight impaired (Blind) you are also entitled to;

- **An extra tax allowance from the date of registration – check with your local tax office**
- **Additional benefits – your local Benefits Agency can give you details**
- **A 50% reduction on any TV licence bought in your name**
- **Parking concessions – you can apply for a 'Blue Badge' which entitles you to park in Disabled parking spaces and can give you free or extended on-street parking. Contact the Blue Badge Unit, Elizabeth II Court, The Castle, Winchester SO23 8UH.**
